Prior to joining Marathon Petroleum in 2018, Mr. Goff was chairman, president and chief executive officer for Andeavor and chairman and chief executive officer of the general partner for Andeavor Logistics LP. Before joining Andeavor in 2010, Mr. Goff worked for ConocoPhillips where he held a number of senior leadership positions including senior vice president Commercial from 2008 to 2010; president Specialty Business and Business Development from 2006 to 2008; president Lower 48, Gulf of Mexico and South America for Exploration and Production from 2004 to 2006; president International Downstream from 2002 to 2004; chairman and managing director Conoco Limited 2000 to 2002; managing director and chief executive officer for Conoco JET Nordic (based in Stockholm, Sweden) from 1998 to 2000 and a number of positions in the company's supply, trading and logistics operations. He has extensive international business experience across Europe, Asia and Latin America.

Mr. Goff earned a Bachelor of Science degree in 1978 and a Master of Business Administration in 1981, both from the University of Utah. Mr. Goff served as chairman of the board for the American Fuel and Petrochemical Manufacturers (AFPM) and is a member of several other boards of directors, including Marathon Petroleum Corporation, Andeavor Logistics LP, PolyOne Corporation, the National Advisory Board for the University of Utah's David Eccles School of Business and the National Society of High School Scholars. He is a member of the Business Council and the San Antonio Economic Development Forum.

Sofia Gonzalez is a high school English teacher, college professor, and published author. She has been in the field of education for more than 10 years and has a deep passion for students who are disadvantaged. She also educates and empowers future teachers in an online teacher preparation program where she believes teachers need as much empowerment as students do. She obtained a double master's degree from the University of Phoenix and St. Xavier University in secondary education/licensure, and reading instruction.

Out of her commitment to education, she started a non-profit called Project 214. Inspired by her first classroom number, she began her career in a gang-infested, impoverished neighborhood in Chicago. Her first job consisted of students who were expelled or dropped out of the Chicago Public School System.

As a result, she saw great disparity and lack of resources for at-risk students. Many, unfortunately, died of gun violence. The organization promotes the power of education by providing basic resources and books to both teachers and students at a local and international level. Her organization has partnerships with schools and communities in Costa Rica, Panama, El Salvador, and Puerto Rico. She believes that ALL students matter, and that the world is a global classroom. She's an advocate and social activist for fair and equitable access to education for all. She currently teaches in her home district, and is happily married with two children.














Member Recognition




